All of the physicians are fellowship trained and offer a full spectrum of upper and lower GI services. In addition, the practice is home to three physicians who have additional fellowship training in advance therapeutic endoscopy, a leadingedge diagnostic and treatment subspecialty of gastroenterology.

Capsule endoscopy, in which patients swallow a small pill with a camera, helps doctors get more accurate views of the small intestine.

Clinical trials are also available to provide access to promising therapies that are not yet available to the general public.

"Most of our procedures can be performed in the comfort and convenience of our free-standing endoscopy center, which meets the highest safety standards as determined by the Accreditation Association for Ambulatory Health Care [AAAHC] and has hosted over 200,000 procedures," notes Dr. LaLuna. "When a hospital visit is required, we're proud to be affiliated with both the Reading Health System and PennState Health St. Joseph networks."

COLONOSCOPY SAVES LIVES

"Colon cancer is the second leading cause of cancer deaths in the U.S.," says Dr. LaLuna, "but regular colon screenings are proven to dramatically reduce the number of cancer diagnoses and cancer deaths." Colonoscopy is the gold standard in detecting precancerous colon polyps, which, if detected early, can be removed before cancer develops.
